Term 2: Vocabulary ctivities

Encourage children to imagine they are holding a caterpillar and describe how it feels.

Create lists of adjectives to describe things, for example; caterpillar – wriggly, squashy, ticklish, furry

Describe how it might feel to:

- Pat an elephant
- Rub a camel
- Walk on wet concrete
- Hug a cactus
