CURRICULUM UPDATE:

Children's Chatter Matters!



Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.

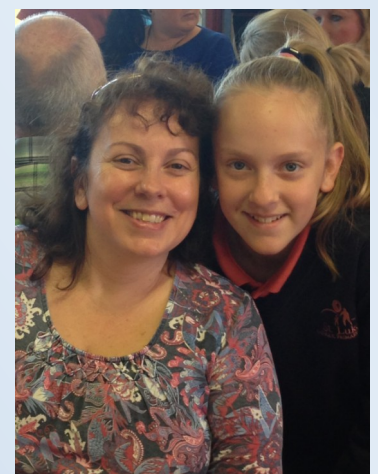
