When you look back now, Mum and Dad were teaching me about good work ethic. While working I had the opportunity to communicate with pickers from many different cultures and learn about their culture. Everything relied on a good season, and when those hail/storm clouds rolled in, or if a frost was predicted in Sept/Oct, you lived this worry with Mum and Dad. I guess, up until my teenage years this was not high in my thoughts because Mum/Dad protected us from such worries. As you get older you learn to appreciate what family does for each other. I certainly do not take for granted my fortunate upbringing. My family loved every moment on the farm, but Mum and Dad also wanted their four children to explore other skills and career pathways if that is what we desired. I think Mum and Dad are happy that they have two teachers, a plumber and an accountant in the family. No, none of us went back on the farm, and we do miss it, but our upbringing on the farm gave us the courage to explore our dreams and faith.

I am really looking forward to my first long weekend in Victoria. This Labour day weekend is in October in NSW, so I am liking the early long weekend!

MAKING JESUS REAL/RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:

Making Jesus Real

The main aim of the Making Jesus Real (MJR) program & the bottom line of Catholic Education is to get students to be aware that they have the spirit of Jesus within them. This is expressed each day by the simple little things we do and say (smile, wave, saying please and thank you, helping people, giving encouraging words, volunteering at home etc, just like you do in your busy life. MJR is simple as we are already doing it and it is just a matter of being switched onto the way we G.T.S. (Greet Treat and Speak to people). These are some of the great MJR initiatives that students can do to bring the spirit alive within themselves and those around them.

- * Be a GIVER rather than a taker.
- * Be a better team player at home (doing as they are asked cheerfully and saying thanks at home a least 4 times daily).
- * Positive attitude to people and life, Believe in themselves (B.I.Y).
- * Be a Grinner and Winner rather a moaner and groaner, Take the good with the bad.
- * Search for the hero inside yourself, search for the secrets you hide.
- * Model at all times WEST attitude
- * Looking at qualities and they picking 3 that they aim to be by the end of the year. (kind Friendly Encouraging, compassionate, helpful, giving of themselves, include others, welcoming, attitude of Gratitude, humble, forgiving, etc.).
- * Peer pressure. "If you want to fly like an eagle don't hang around with the turkeys."
- * Born to try, "the future lies in my hands"
- * Reflecting over my day, 3 things that I should be thankful for that happened today. "A day is wasted if you don't reflect on it. Where was the spirit of Jesus in my life today?
- Compass points for life. Class go through MJR pick 20 attitudes they want for life, bring it down to 10 then 5 and then 1 which is the "Key to their life" the 10 are their compass points for life, we then do orienteering with compasses around the school to get the message.

Scripture Focus: Each fortnight our school community will focus on a piece of scripture linked to a social skills focus to make that important connection between our lives and the life-giving message of God's Holy Word.

'Love the Lord Your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest commandment,' said Jesus.' Matt.22: 37-38.

Reporting and Assessment 2016

At St. Luke's Catholic Primary School, our formal reporting systems include written reports at the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2, Parent/Teacher Interviews in Term 1 and Student/Parent/Teacher Interviews in Term 3. Please note that **there are some changes to the timing of these reporting systems for 2016**, as outlined below:

Children's Chatter Matters!

Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level. Ten activities will be provided over this term targeting phonological awareness skills. Phonological awareness is one of the key building blocks for reading and writing. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.

 $\overline{2}$. When learning to read and spell words, children need to be able to blend individual sounds together to form new words. For example, t - o - p = top. You can support your child to practice blending sounds together by separating sounds in words and asking them to say what the word is. Use words from their book.

You could also incorporate this into everyday conversation, e.g. "Can you please put this in the b-i-n (bin)", "We are going to t-ar-g-et (target) to buy a your friend a present", "Put on you b-oo-t-s (boots)".

Dear parents

At our school we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

Sometimes, it can be difficult for parents or carers to know what to do when their child talks to them about bullying.

You are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

 Listen calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need to: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

- Listen calmly and set the full story.
- Reassure your child that they are not to blame.
- 3. Ask your child what they want to do about it and how you can help
- 4. Visit www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies.
- Contact the school.
- 6. Check in regularly with your child.



- Reassure your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'.
- 3. Ask your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.
- 4. Visit www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practise strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.
- 5. Contact the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.
- 6. Check in regularly with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

Here are the steps outlined by School Sport Victoria: how to register online for these trials:

The online registration process is open and will close on the 16 March 2016.

Students who turn 13 this year are not eligible to trial.

Step 1: Students consult with Sport teacher/Principal prior to registering on line.

They will give permission for the student to proceed with registering on line only should the student be deemed capable to represent the school and participate in a state level trial. For Division trials schools are required to endorse students with advanced skills.

- **Step 2:** Once the student has been given permission from the Sport Teacher/Principal at their school to register, the family of the student can then proceed to register online and pay the Non-Refundable \$25 Fee. www.ssv.edu.au/teamvic
- **Step 3:** Once registered the family will receive an email confirming receipt of registration. This email will contain 2 attachments, one will be a tax receipt and the second will be an e-ticket.
- **Step 4:** The student must take this ticket back to their school to obtain the signature of the Sport Teacher & Principal. This signature must be obtained before the date of the division trial. This signed e-ticket must then be handed to the Division Trial Coordinator on the day of the trial. (**No Ticket, No Trial**)
- **Step 5:** Shortly after the registration for Division Trials close, Division Coordinators will email the registered students and inform them of the time & place of the trial.
- **Step 6:** After the Division trials are conducted successful students will be given information regarding Region Trials. Those students who are selected at Region Trials will proceed to State Trials (these students will need to re-register and pay the applicable registration fee)

Basketball only - After the Division Trials are conducted students who are asked to proceed will attend a Conference Trial (additional fees are applicable at this level)

Guidelines

Sporting Chance aims to provide support to Greater Shepparton residents to become more active in sporting clubs and the local community.

To be eligible applicants must be

- A resident of Greater Shepparton, although their sporting activity may be outside the municipality

 In possession of a valid Health Care Card or Pension Card
- Clubs, businesses and groups are not eligible to apply

Conditions

- Scholarships up to \$150 per applicant are available
- No assistance will be given for retrospective expenses (expenses already paid)
 Funding will not be provided directly to applicants. FamilyCare will arrange direct payments to clubs, businesses or organisations.
- experiences so outcomes can be recorded
- Only one application per person can be submitted within a 12 month period
- · Submitting an application does not guarantee funding
- Incomplete applications may not be considered
- Applicants over the age of 18 years who are no longer full-time at secondary school are required to volunteer their time equivalent to the grant amount applied for. Volunteering is calculated at \$25 per hour. To obtain a grant for \$150, a total of 6 hours of volunteering is required to be eligible for example. Applicants are required to obtain a Volunteer haspsport to complete their volunteer hours at an approved volunteering organisation.

 Applicants seeking sports equipment, footwear or uniforms agree to obtain these items from the Greater Shepparton Sports Equipment Library located at the Shepparton Sports Stadium 120 Nimyrksh Pond Shepparton Sports Faujment Library located.
- 120 Numurkah Road Shepparton as their first preference. If the Sports Equipment Library does not have suitable items, an application can be made for new items from a list we will provide.

 Applicants seeking football boots agree to obtain their boots from the AFL Goulburn Murray
- Boot Bank located at Kialla Park Community Centre, Reserve Street Kialla. If the Boot Bank does not have suitable boots an application can be made for a new pair, from a list we will provide.

What can be funded?

- First preference will be given to applicants applying for club membership and/or participation fees Sports equipment, footwear and uniforms - based on the condition that there are no suitable items from the Greater Shepparton Sports Equipment Library or AFL Goulburn Murray Boot Bank

Applications must be submitted by the closing date, by email, post or delivery to FamilyCare, 19 Welsford Street Shepparton.

Applications will be assessed by a panel consisting of FamilyCare and Greater Shepparton City Council representatives.
