### **MY HERITAGE, MY STORY...**

St. Patrick's day is special for me, but yesterday I found time to pray for all our families. We all have a story, a journey, and a heritage. I'm not sure how you feel, but at times I feel guilty celebrating, when others are doing it tough in the world. I feel blessed every day because I am part of a school where we celebrate being one and help each other.

My story has an Irish/Scottish experience. My Mum's maiden name is McLean. During the holidays we will be celebrating a McLean reunion, which I am really looking forward to. But today, I share with you a story about my Grandad. Grandad Peter Keenan decided to come to Australia when he was 18, back in the 1920s. He lived in Newry (near Kilkeel and Rostrevor), near the border in Ireland. He came by ship, with only the clothes he was wearing and 32 pound borrowed from his uncle (32 pound was quite a lot of money). He spent a few months in the lower deck of the ship and would occasionally look up through the manhole and see how the rest of the world were living.

He arrived in Sydney. He made a few dollars around the wharf which helped him financially. He wanted to farm and he was smart in his thinking. Griffith was an irrigation area and he could make a go of this fertile land. He made his way to Griffith and started his life, our life! He met my grandmother, Susan, who had also travelled to Australia from Ireland, aged 18, very intelligent and loved poetry. I may share her story some day. They married and farm 81 Yoogali became their home, my home.

Last night I had dinner with my family and at grace we thanked God for our food and family.

I will share many stories over the years and I know they may trigger thoughts with you all. Family is special and this week I thank God for the stories of all the families at St. Luke's.

We didn't plan on a full blown blackout this morning. A real lights out!

## *Making Jesus Real*

The main aim of the Making Jesus Real (MJR) program & the bottom line of Catholic Education is to get students to be aware that they have the spirit of Jesus within them. This is expressed each day by the simple little things we do and say (smile, wave, saying please and thank you, helping people, giving encouraging words, volunteering at home etc, just like you do in your busy life. MJR is simple as we are already doing it and it is just a matter of being switched onto the way we G.T.S. (Greet Treat and Speak to people). These are some of the great MJR initiatives that students can do to bring the spirit alive within themselves and those around them.

- \* Be a GIVER rather than a taker.
- \* Be a better team player at home (doing as they are asked cheerfully and saying thanks at home a least 4 times daily).
- \* Positive attitude to people and life, Believe in themselves (B.I.Y).
- \* Be a Grinner and Winner rather a moaner and groaner, Take the good with the bad.
- \* Search for the hero inside yourself, search for the secrets you hide.
- \* Model at all times WEST attitude
- \* Looking at qualities and they picking 3 that they aim to be by the end of the year.  
(kind Friendly Encouraging, compassionate, helpful, giving of themselves, include others, welcoming, attitude of Gratitude, humble, forgiving, etc.).
- \* Peer pressure. "If you want to fly like an eagle don't hang around with the turkeys."
- \* Born to try, "the future lies in my hands"
- \* Reflecting over my day, 3 things that I should be thankful for that happened today. "A day is wasted if you don't reflect on it. Where was the spirit of Jesus in my life today?"
- Compass points for life. Class go through MJR pick 20 attitudes they want for life, bring it down to 10 then 5 and then 1 which is the "Key to their life" the 10 are their compass points for life, we then do orienteering with compasses around the school to get the message.

**Scripture Focus:** Each fortnight our school community will focus on a piece of scripture linked to a social skills focus to make that important connection between our lives and the life-giving message of God's Holy Word.

**CURRICULUM UPDATE:**

**Children's Chatter Matters!**

Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level. Ten activities will be provided over this term targeting phonological awareness skills. Phonological awareness is one of the key building blocks for reading and writing. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.



**g.** When learning to read and spell words, children also need to be able to segment, or break words into sounds. *For example, the word 'sack' can be split into s – a – ck. It has 3 sounds.* Help your child to 'find' sounds and 'break up' a word into sounds through practice, using words from their book/around the room. Start with simple words, with two or three sounds. Your child might need to use fingers/blocks to support.

**Here are the steps outlined by School Sport Victoria: how to register online for these trials:**

The online registration process is open and will close on the **16 March 2016**.

**Students who turn 13 this year are not eligible to trial.**

**Step 1:** Students consult with Sport teacher/Principal prior to registering on line.

They will give permission for the student to proceed with registering on line only should the student be deemed capable to represent the school and participate in a state level trial. For Division trials schools are required to endorse students with advanced skills.

**Step 2:** Once the student has been given permission from the Sport Teacher/Principal at their school to register, the family of the student can then proceed to register online and pay the Non-Refundable \$25 Fee. [www.ssv.edu.au/teamvic](http://www.ssv.edu.au/teamvic)

**Step 3:** Once registered the family will receive an email confirming receipt of registration. This email will contain 2 attachments, one will be a tax receipt and the second will be an e-ticket.

**Step 4:** The student must take this ticket back to their school to obtain the signature of the Sport Teacher & Principal. This signature must be obtained before the date of the division trial. This signed e-ticket must then be handed to the Division Trial Coordinator on the day of the trial. **(No Ticket, No Trial)**

**Step 5:** Shortly after the registration for Division Trials close, Division Coordinators will email the registered students and inform them of the time & place of the trial.

**Step 6:** After the Division trials are conducted successful students will be given information regarding Region Trials. Those students who are selected at Region Trials will proceed to State Trials ( these students will need to re-register and pay the applicable registration fee)

**Basketball only** - After the Division Trials are conducted students who are asked to proceed will attend a Conference Trial (additional fees are applicable at this level)

Once students have individually collected 10 tokens they can redeem them for exclusive School Banking reward items in recognition of their continued savings behaviour. **Get involved in the School Banking program.**

You can get involved in the School Banking program by opening a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account at any Commonwealth Bank branch, over the phone on 13 2221, or via NetBank if you are an existing customer with NetBank access. Remember to take in identification for you and your child (driver's license and birth certificate). You will receive a Dollarmites wallet and deposit book that your child will use to participate in the program.

Our school receives \$5 when a student makes their first ever School Banking deposit and 5% on every deposit made through the school (to a maximum of \$10 per individual deposit). Children need to tell their teacher or come to the Office straight away. Thank you.



#### How the program works,

Customers that join Fairleys Supa IGA Community Rewards program receive a bar coded key tag that needs to be scanned at the checkout each time they shop Fairleys Supa IGA supermarket or liquor store in Shepparton, so points can be allocated.

- Funding will not be provided directly to applicants. FamilyCare will arrange direct payments to clubs, businesses or organisations.
- Successful applicants agree to provide feedback on their playing experiences so outcomes can be recorded
- Only one application per person can be submitted within a 12 month period
- Submitting an application does not guarantee funding
- Incomplete applications may not be considered
- Applicants over the age of 18 years who are no longer full-time at secondary school are required to volunteer their time equivalent to the grant amount applied for. Volunteering is calculated at \$25 per hour. To obtain a grant for \$150, a total of 6 hours of volunteering is required to be eligible for example. Applicants are required to obtain a Volunteer Passport to complete their volunteer hours at an approved volunteering organisation.

Presently children as young as 12 years old are picking cocoa in West Africa to make the chocolate we eat.

Some of these children are trafficked. Most are forced to pick cocoa from an early age, for minimal or no wages, for long hours, in dangerous working conditions, without any chance of attending school

**The International Labor Rights Forum (ILRF) estimates there are 500,000 – 1,500,000 children working in the cocoa sector in West Africa.**

A global movement has begun to change this. The movement tackles poverty and empowers producers through trade. When you choose your chocolate look for a label that shows the cocoa has been sourced ethically.

That means it doesn't come from the sweat and tears of children, trafficked or in forced labour.
