Day 1:

Mary MacKillop wrote to her mother on 14 May, 1867:

I have such an earnest longing for the Order of St Joseph and know well how hard it will be to get it established here, but everything God blesses will prosper and surely God's blessing attends this holy Order; none other is so fitted for the wants of this Colony.

On August 21 she wrote:

When I parted with you, I little imagined that I could so soon have the happiness of being allowed to make my profession, which I did on my favourite festival, the Assumption... 'Tis true I only seek to serve God in the care of the little ones of God's flock.

Provident God,

You called Mary MacKillop to serve you in the religious life. May men and women be open to your call to religious life today. May the ministry of religious throughout the world, especially the Sisters of St Joseph, respond to the Gospel call to 'act justly, love tenderly and walk humbly' with their God. We make this prayer through Christ, the way, and the Spirit of Joy. Saint Mary of the Cross, responding to the Holy Spirit, pray with us. AMEN.

Small trip back in History

Not that long ago, the bushes/trees near the current shelter/playground were the boundary for the school. On the other side was a channel and a paddock with cows (current basketball/netball courts). As our school develops changes need to be made. An OHS Audit in 2015 highlighted the fact that these small trees inhibit supervision. These have been removed and will be replaced (another location) once our footpath network is in place. Thanks Mr. Preston for doing this and moving the sand in the sandpit so we can plan to box this space. Anytime, you are in the office, pop into the meeting room and take a look at the master landscape & building draft plan. We are making a few slight changes, but you will get the idea.

Child Safe

A number of policies and procedures have been developed in recent times. These will be uploaded to our webpage. All schools are required to adhere to new Child Safe Standards that have been introduced this year. All students enrolled, and any child visiting, have the right to feel safe and be safe in all school environments and outside of school hours. The wellbeing of children in our care will always be our first priority and we have zero tolerance to child abuse.

Carpark

A reminder to take extra care in the carpark. We do have pedestrian crossings, but sometimes children do not use these. Please be aware and look out for toddlers and school children.

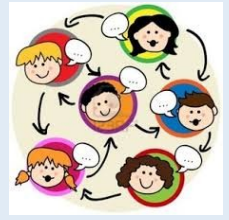

Curriculum Update:

Children's Chatter Matters!

Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level. Ten activities will be provided over this term targeting phonological awareness skills. Phonological awareness is one of the key building blocks for reading and writing. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.



3. After reading a story with your child, you could use one of these trigger phrases to improve the complexity of your child's language. Model the entire phrase initially then gradually encourage your child to say the longer sentence by him/herself.

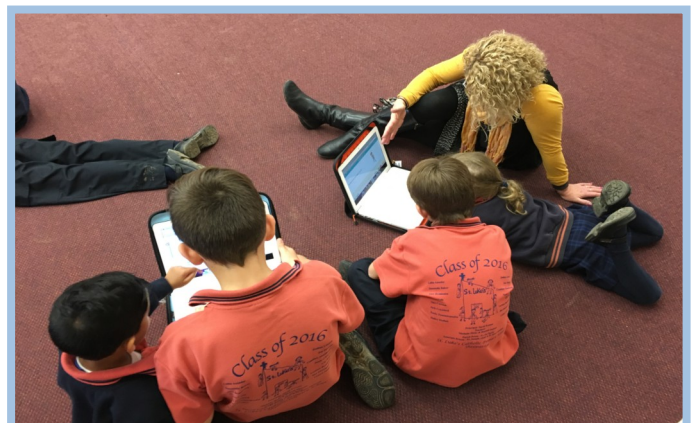
