On Monday 15th August we celebrate The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Assumption is a holy day of obligation. The commemoration of the death of the Blessed Virgin Mary is known as the Assumption because of the tradition that her body was raised up, body and soul into heaven. This tradition was already present in the sixth century.

The Liturgical colour is 'white'. White is the colour of heaven. Liturgically, it is used to celebrate feasts of the Lord; Christmas and Easter, the great seasons of the Lord; and the saints. (Universalis)

There are many paintings and drawing symbolising the Assumption. It is an interesting exercise to look at how artists, from all over the world view the events of the Lord. I have chosen the beauty of a sunrise to symbolise a new day, new life, creation and the Assumption.




## Curriculum Update:

### Children's Chatter Matters!

Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level. Ten activities will be provided over this term targeting phonological awareness skills. Phonological awareness is one of the key building blocks for reading and writing. It is listening to, and thinking about the sounds in words.



5. Encourage your child to include the following parts when retelling a story/ experience: who/ where/ when/ what happened/ feelings/ why. Encourage them to use some joining words such as because, if, when, but, so, however, until, or, unless, then, consequently, before, after as, instead of. You might like to start a sentence for them to finish.  
e.g. Just after breakfast, my brother and I had a fight. He used my Spongebob toothbrush. Yuck!!! I hate it when he uses my Spongebob toothbrush because his breath stinks. Mum wasn't very pleased with us and said we couldn't have a treat after school.




**Eftpos** facility – available at the school office - cheque, savings or credit (not American express).



### CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) - DAIRY ASSISTANCE

Program Background	As part of the Victorian Government's dairy assistance package the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) is being extended to students currently enrolled in government and non-government schools whose parents own, share-farm or lease a dairy farm business; or those people whose primary occupation is working on a dairy farm.
Who is eligible?	<p>Students currently enrolled at the start of Term 3, 2016 in government and non-government schools where one or both parents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>own an operating dairy farm</li> <li>are share farmers on a property primarily operating as a dairy farm</li> <li>hold a lease for an operating dairy farm</li> <li>work as an employee on an operating dairy farm and this is their main source of employment.</li> </ul> <p><b>Evidence may include:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a dairy industry license issued by Dairy Food Safety Victoria (DFS V)</li> <li>lease documentation</li> <li>share farming contract</li> <li>agreement with a dairy production/supply company</li> <li>a letter from an employer</li> <li>a statutory declaration stating the family's main business or employment is on an operating dairy farm (in cases where other forms of evidence are not available).</li> <li>Confirmation from a kindergarten that a younger sibling has been approved for the dairy Kindergarten Fee Subsidy on the basis of being an eligible dairy farming family (as above)</li> </ul> <p>Families who received the means-tested CSEF payment are also eligible. However families that have previously qualified for the CSEF Drought assistance are not able to also access the CSEF Dairy assistance funding.</p>
How much is the dairy assistance payment?	A one-off amount of \$375 per student will be paid to schools.
Do parent's need to apply for this assistance?	Yes. Parents/legal guardians and independent secondary students will need to apply for this assistance via the Dairy Assistance Application Form along with evidence as requested by 18 November 2016. (FORMS AVAILABLE FROM THE SCHOOL WEBSITE)



## SWOOPING MAGPIES



Between July and November, magpies defend their young from threats. Some magpies see us as threats—and they swoop!

If you know what to do when a magpie swoops, you can stay safe and let these birds raise their young.

**Mark July on your calendar** to show that magpies will soon be breeding and watch out for them.

**Get to know where magpies breed in your area.** If there is a swooping magpie, go to the Department of Environment and Heritage Protection (EHP) website [www.ehp.qld.gov.au](http://www.ehp.qld.gov.au) and print out a warning sign to let others know.

**Avoid the zone** defended by the male magpie if you can (about 150 metres around the nest if you're on foot or 150 metres if you're on a bike).

If you have to go through the defence zone follow these safety tips:

### SAFETY TIPS

- ✓ **Wear a hat and sunglasses** or just hold something like a school bag or umbrella over your head.
- ✓ Some magpies only swoop at cyclists. If you **get off your bike and walk**, the magpie should leave you alone.
- ✓ **'Spike up' your bike helmet** with a few cable ties to scare magpies away.
- ✓ Magpies are less likely to swoop if you **walk in a group**. Team up with others if you walk through a nesting area.
- ✓ **Watch magpies**. If they know they're being watched they are less likely to swoop.
- ✓ **Don't fight back**. Throwing sticks at a magpie will only make it more defensive next time.
- ✓ **Never approach a young magpie** that's out of the nest. The parents may think you're trying to harm it. Rescuing baby magpies is best left for wildlife rescue groups to carry out after dark.

Watch out for the baby magpies. When they leave the nest, the parents stop swooping. Magpies only swoop for around six to eight weeks: from when the eggs are laid until the young leave the nest. If there are large young in the nest, it should only be a few days before they leave and the swooping stops.

### When a magpie becomes dangerous

If a magpie that is defending its nest becomes aggressive and a risk to human safety, the magpie may be removed.




### Lunch Orders:
