It is Jesus who stirs in you the desire to do something great with your lives'

Potato Olympics:

On Friday the the 19th of August the Junior Learning Community celebrated their learning about cultures and mathematics through the fun filled event - The Potato Olympics. Rain was not going to stop us!! Prior to the day students built a personal relationship with a potato. They selected a country they hoped to learn about and that became the nationality of their little spud. Each potato received a name, a date of birth and even an Olympic sport talent. The students had to fill in details on a 'potato passport' of their own heritage and their potatoes.

On the day, the students were no longer just one/two's - they became trainers of an athlete! And their maths skills were really put to the test! Our day began with an opening ceremony - an Olympic flame and all!!

The events that the 'trainers' and potatoes competed in were: Long Distance - students measured the length of their potatoes roll. Triathlon - students read co-ordinates on a map to locate different flags. Equestrian - potatoes and their horses ran hurdles **adding** a specific score for every hurdle they jumped over.

Bowling - potatoes were hurled into bowling pins and trainers **multiplied** their pins by 5 or by 2. (lots of potato injuries occurred in this sport)

Synchronized Swimming - Potatoes swam and danced in a bucket of water while trainers kept an eye on an **analogue clock** and **timed one minute** beginning at different intervals.

Our memorable day concluded with each potato and trainer receiving a gold medal for their outstanding mathematics and sportsmanship! Thank-you to all parents who were able to come and support the students at the opening ceremony and with the events during the day!!

8. The conjunction 'because' helps to explain cause and effect. You can use 'what's wrong pictures' to generate sentences and get your child to explain and justify why the picture is funny. For example:









This picture is silly BECAUSE the little dog has a bigger bone than big dog. Remember 'just because' is not an acceptable answer, make sure your child explains why.

Encourage older children to explain double meanings and word play in jokes. For example: this joke is funny BECAUSE...... Clocks tick, the lips are sticking to the clock and when the words are joined together it makes lipstick.







Free SunSmart app

Overexposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation causes wrinkles and skin and eye damage, ultimately leading to skin cancer.

UV cannot be seen or felt. It is not like the sun's light which we see, or the sun's warmth (infrared radiation) which we feel. Our senses cannot detect UV so it can be damaging without us knowing.

The free SunSmart app tells you when sun protection is recommended for your location using forecast information from the Bureau of Meteorology website and live LIV data from APPANSA.



Sun Smart:



We are SunSmart - a note for families

Too much UV can cause sunburn, skin and eye damage and skin cancer.

Overexposure to UV during childhood and adolescence is a major factor for future skin cancer risk.

You can't see or feel the sun's UV so don't be fooled. Whatever the weather, if the UV levels are three or more, it's important to *Slip, Slop, Slap, Seek* and *Slide*!

Our school aims to protect children and staff from too much UV to help minimise future skin cancer risk. We are a registered member of the Cancer Council Victoria's SunSmart Program. Please help support our SunSmart membership by ensuring your child follows the SunSmart measures included in our policy.

During the daily local sun protection times (issued whenever UV levels are three and above), use these 5 SunSmart steps – even if it's cool and cloudy.

- Slip on a shirt for free dress days, ensure your child wears clothing that covers as much skin as possible (e.g. elbow length tops with a higher neckline or collar and longer style shorts or skirts). Densely woven fabrics are best.
- Slop on SPF 30 (or higher) broadspectrum, water-resistant sunscreen – apply a generous amount of sunscreen at the start of the day and make sure children have sunscreen in their bag ready to be reapplied throughout the day. Please ensure they get plenty of sunscreen application practice at home so they'll be all set when they are at school.
- Slap on a hat one that protects the face, neck and ears such as a broad brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat. Peak caps do not offer enough protection and are not



recommended by SunSmart. Please help your child remember to bring and wear their approved hat.

- Seek shade choose shady spots for play whenever possible.
- Slide on some sunglasses if practical and approved by the school. Make sure they are labelled AS 1067 and cover as much of the eye area as possible.

Sun protection times

Don't just wait for hot and sunny days to use sun protection. Check the sun protection times each day so your family can be protected when they need to be.

Daily local sun protection times and weather details are available from the SunSmart widget on our school website, in the weather section of the newspaper, on the SunSmart website at sunsmart.com.au and as a free SunSmart app. Sun protection times can also be found at the Bureau of Meteorology website and live UV levels are available from ARPANSA.
