In 2017 we will have a new Reporting

System. The current system will no longer be used in any schools with the change to the Victorian Curriculum. As part of this reporting change we are investigating a package which also provides a Parent Portal. The main aim of the Parent Portal will be to provide ongoing academic and social feedback online, 24 hours a day. As a system, Sandhurst is looking at what may be a suitable option for all our schools. One thing is certain, we will have a new semester reporting system in 2017.

Thank you students and staff for your efforts in Term 3. I have been impressed with the end product in 1/2 (Book Launch), 3/4 (Australian History), Year 5/6 Gold Rush Expo and our Preps' writing on the "dotted thirds" is coming along well!! This is only touching the surface of what is happening in the classroom, so well done students and staff.

The **atmosphere** around the school is buzzing at the moment, not just because it is Spring. 
The book fair this year has again been a great success. The support shown by the school community has enabled books to the value of over


