This striking image was captured by Reuter photographer Ammar Awad in 2010. During clashes between Israeli troops and Palestinians in the refugee camp Shuafat, near Jerusalem, a tiny Palestinian girl is seen calmly walking towards her school, seemingly unconcerned by the violence and destruction around her. The street is strewn with rocks thrown by protesters in the direction of the Israeli troops who can be seen behind the girl in protective shields.



Recently, I was asked to reflect on this image. I don't want to distort your personal reflection if you get time. I will leave you with some words I shared from Pope Francis. Next week, I will share some of my reflection.

It is challenging to express our love for and pray for our enemies, but it is possible. In Laudato Si' Pope Francis challenges us to show love for society.

"In order to make society more human, more worthy of the human person, love in social life - political, economic, and cultural, - must be given renewed value becoming the constant and highest norm for all activity" (Laudato Si, p.177).


Employment



Junior soccer talent nvited to trial for GV Suns Junior Squads and Skill Acquisition Programs

From Wednesday 12 October the GV Suns soccer club will hold trials for its 2017 U 12 junior squads and Skills Acquisition Program (SAP) U8, 9, 10, and 11 age groups. The trials will run across three consecutive Wednesday nights (12, 19 and 26 October) at John McEwen Reserve, Brauman St, Shepparton.

The GV Suns provide local youth talent the opportunity to train locally under experienced and qualified coaches and highly qualified Technical Directors and then test their development each weekend by playing the best in the state as part of the National Premier League (NPL).

More home games

In 2017 GV Suns junior teams will travel to Melbourne for only nine of the 27 rounds. The other 18 rounds will be played at home at the redeveloped Shepparton Sports Precinct.

Modified competition for Under 12s

From 2017 the FFV has introduced a 9v9 competition on a smaller size pitch for National Premier Leagues under 12 age groups. NPL clubs including the GV Suns will enter two 12-member squads in this age group. Players born in 2005 and 2006 can trial for the Under 12 squads.

Skill Acquisition Program to fast track skill development

The Under 12 squad is the most junior in the GV Suns teams. Younger players (born in 2007 or later) can build on their skills and knowledge through the SAP while also continuing to play their school based or team based soccer.

The SAP 18 week program is set out as 3 blocks of 6 weeks of training two nights per week with a gala in Melbourne at the end of each block. It is a great way to fast track the soccer curriculum and an excellent way to gain experience against other talented players.







