We are very fortunate at St. Luke's to be large enough to have a multiple Learning Communities across each cohort. In my previous school we had seven straight grades. There was limited flexibility. The students met all the teachers, including new staff for 2017, Miss Simpson (Art & 3/4), Miss Mercuri (Italian & 3/4), Mr. Kent (1/2) & although we already know Mrs Segrave, she is joining us full -time in 5/6.

Grant Application

We have submitted a grant for 4 new General Learning Areas. Our Master Plan (which you can see in the front office) has been in the consultation stage prior to 2016. This year we brought our landscape and building plans together and formed our overall site plan for 2017 and for the next 10-20 years. I say 10-20 years because it all depends on State and Federal funding. Local knowledge is essential when going through the process and I thank Paul Ranson (Board Chair) for leading our school board through the journey for the past two years. JWS (Bernie Jovaras) is our architect and has been great in working with us and Spiire (surveyors/landscape/irrigation/oval) We will be notified of the outcome later next year.

Update on paths, irrigation, oval

By Christmas, we should know a timeframe for paths, irrigation and drainage. Once these things are in place we will be in a better position to begin the actual development of our oval.

It is an exciting time to be at St. Luke's, but we all know that until the first stone is turned we cannot look too far ahead.




