Buildings / Facilities:

The school opened in 2005 with two classrooms and an Administration area. In 2007 we added an additional two classrooms. We moved into an additional FOUR new classrooms commencement of 2010, with extensions to the Administration Area and a NEW Learning Centre completed in Term 3 of 2011. Our grounds and facilities are continually under improvement.

Our NEW stadium was also completed by the end of 2011 with a multipurpose court. Two new Learning Areas and an Amenities block were completed in 2013. We currently have a Learning Area for our Out of School Hours Care facility (ie After School Care). In 2015 we extended our Car Park creating over 60 new spaces and our future aim is the development of our Oval. In 2016 we added roof mounted basketball hoops to our stadium.

The zone for St. Luke's Catholic Primary School is north of Pine Road to Boundary Road.

Families seeking to cross these zones (boundaries) for any reason are requested to approach the Principal of the school in the zone which they reside to discuss reasons for seeking approval to do so.

If a family with children enrolled in the school moves from the school zone, the children may continue at the school.

2017 School Curriculum

Infant Development Program:

The children in Years Prep have the opportunity to participate in this program developing fine motor skills, cooperative thinking and problem solving skills at the commencement of each year. This program has been broadened to embrace elements of Play Based Curriculum approaches.


Year Prep Screening Program:

This strategy involves early assessment of children's skills and understandings of sounds, letters, numbers, concepts and general numeracy/literacy skills. The new Year Prep students work with their classroom teacher in a "one to one" session in the first few weeks of the school year to gather important data.

Social Emotional Learning:

Through the use of the Making Jesus Real, Religious Education, Buddies, Turning the Tide, Friendly Kids-Friendly Classrooms, Healthy Relationships, Anti-Bullying & Resilience Programs, You Can Do It, Friendly Schools and Families....., we continue to focus on individual growth in positive peer relations and Social Skills development.

At St. Luke's, <u>all</u>, in the community are encouraged to be the very best they can possibly be!



Performing Arts:

A Specialist Teacher delivers this aspect of "The Arts" according to the Curriculum for Victorian Schools.

Our program involves drama, movement, music and oral language.

We also offer School Performance Choir experiences for children from Years 2-6 from time to time.

Visual Arts:

We offer a sequential Prep \sim 6 Visual Arts program facilitated by a specialist visual arts teacher.

Physical Education:

Each Learning Group attends a weekly physical education class with our teachers as part of the Bluearth School Discovery Program in conjunction with participation in regular sport clinics, interschool sporting events, intraschool sporting events locally and opportunities exist to represent our region at State level.

Studies of Italian Language & Culture / Indigenous Studies :

Whilst our Studies of Languages/ Indigenous programs focus on the language, culture, cuisine, customs and traditions of other cultures. Our "experiential" program enhances tolerance and understanding in addition to providing a specific "taste" of the Italian language, culture and traditions. Our Languages program in Italian is offered from Years Prep to Year 6 to supplement our existing approaches to this area of the curriculum.

Environmental Programs:

We continue to develop and offer a Curriculum ~ based Whole School Environmental Education Program, in conjunction with the Diocese of Sandhurst, to bring our school closer in line with the Sustainable Schools' philosophy and practice. Our unique partnership with Shepparton Access to form "ECOpark", continually under development on our site, is a ground-breaking partnership in Environmental Education and Sustainability.

Literacy & Numeracy Support:


We are able to provide extra support in the classroom, whether this is through direct funding or a Learning Community need. In Foundation this year we employed two full time learning supports to work with the diverse needs of the children until they became familiar with learning. This makes the 3 -4 orientation days really important as it helps us to prepare for the upcoming year.

Weekend Sport:

Our school hosts a growing number of school sporting teams entered in the local weekend competition in Netball and Soccer. We currently field teams in both these sports, with children also welcome at St. Brendan's, St. Mel's or other local schools where we have insufficient numbers to offer our own teams.







St Brendan's Parish is vibrant and engaging; it works with the grace of God to build God's kingdom in the midst of Shepparton.

Parish Links:

As the second Catholic Primary School for the St. Brendan's
Parish we ensure that our community retains close links with
our parish centre despite our geographical location away
from our parish buildings. Father Joe Taylor and
Fr. Berny Augustine regularly call at the school to take
part in Liturgies, assemblies, meetings, etc... and to visit the
children and staff. We also maintain close links with St. Brendan's
Primary School and Notre Dame College sharing resources, facilities,

ideas and experiences. Our school community is well represented on the Goulburn Valley Deanery of Catholic Schools, Catholic Education Shepparton / Mooroopna and Emmaus Master Plan groups. Since the establishment of the Year 9 Emmaus Campus in 2009, "across the oval", we have continued to develop and maintain close links with the students and staff of this exciting new educational community.

Our children generally demonstrate a genuine care and concern for one another and the school is very well supported by our parents, particularly through involvement in the St. Luke's Community Group and School Board. We pride ourselves on being a welcoming environment where all members of our community are respected and valued.



Luke was a gentile Christian. He accompanied Paul on some of his missionary journeys. He attended Paul during his imprisonment. Luke is responsible for both the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament. St. Luke is sometimes referred to as the physician and/or the artist. He is described as "the scribe of the gentle kindness of Christ". Each of four evangelists has a particular symbol. Luke is an Ox (a farm animal). Research in the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles will show many reasons why he is a great patron of a new school. His description of the growth of the early Christian communities models the vision and objectives of our new school community. In this Gospel he presents Jesus as the attractive companion in life who reveals God's love for us. The Grace Road site is called Emmaus. Chapter 24 of Luke's Gospel tells the story of the encounter on the road to Emmaus of the disciples and the Risen Lord. They moved from non recognition to joyful sharing of the good news that Christ had risen.

History:

For many years St. Brendan's Primary School, St. Mel's Primary School and Notre Dame College have provided a Catholic Education for Shepparton and its surrounding areas. As the Shepparton region has grown in recent years and the desire by parents for a Catholic Education has increased along with this growth the three schools have been increasingly under pressure to provide places for those who seek the values of Catholic Education. Planning and foresight by the leaders of the Catholic Education in the Shepparton region led to the establishment of Catholic Education Shepparton group. This group over several years has looked at the needs of local Catholic communities. Although the concept of another Catholic Primary School has been an intention for many years, the CES with the support of the Bishop, local Parish Priests and the Catholic Education Office in Bendigo has brought this dream to a reality. The 18 hectares that has been set aside to ensure the long term strength and diversity of Primary Catholic Education in Shepparton. In years to come the possibility exists to develop this site into a Catholic Education Campus incorporating not only Primary but possible Secondary and even Tertiary facilities for the Catholic communities of the area.

Leadership Team

The School Leadership Team is comprised of staff with key responsibilities and positions of Leadership in the School. Our School Leadership Team (2017) is Mr David Keenan (Principal), Mr Mark Harmer (Deputy Principal), Miss Lauren Calder (3/4 Learning Community Leader / Literacy and Numeracy Coordinator), Mrs Michelle Hicks (5/6 Learning Community Leader) and Mrs Carolyn Kent (Foundation - to Year 2 Learning Community Leader).

School Board

The School Board comprises a group of parents appointed by the school community or elected by the Parish Priest and School Principal, representatives from the School Staff, Community Group (Parents & Friends) and parish.

The Board meets in the evening for around 2 hours once per month.

The **School Board** is an advisory body to assist the Parish Priest (Parish Priest / Parish Administrator) and Principal.

The *School Board* provides advice, general overview and policy direction for the school.

The *Parish Priest* is responsible for the legal and canonical obligations associated with the school.

The *Principal*, who is appointed by the Parish Priest, is responsible for the day to day educational and administrative functions of the school.

The **AIM** of the School Board is to *lead the school community in partnership with the Parish Priest, the Principal and the School Leadership Team, under the guidelines of the Sandhurst School Improvement Framework and according to our School Strategic Plan.*

Our School Board has 3 main functions:

LEADERSHIP ~ providing Leadership <u>within</u> and <u>for</u> the school community.

PLANNING \sim assisting in the development of an Annual Implementation Plan and a Master Plan.

COORDINATION ~ ensuring the School Improvement Plans are put into action through the appointment of SUBGROUPS & WORKING PARTIES.

Involvement in the School Board is extremely rewarding and provides members with a sense of ownership and satisfaction at having genuine input into the future direction of the school.

Technology Provision:



Our technology resources are continually being improved. Our computer network links classroom computers across the school to the Catholic Education Victoria Network having links to the Education Department resources and the Internet. The computers are housed in the classroom, being a natural part of the learning process as a tool for research, creativity, problem solving, designing and for publishing work. In Years 3/4/5/6 we have a 1:1 Macbook program. In 2015 we introduced iPads across Foundation ~ 2 in addition to providing MacBooks. Staff make use of our wireless network for planning and accessing up to date online materials.



St. Luke's Buddy System







An important part of creating a community and sense of welcome and belonging is the buddy system, which operates at St. Luke's Catholic Primary School.

Each year, the Foundation Year students are paired with a Year Six student (and Year Five if numbers require).

The Year Six student is a 'buddy' for the Foundation student: someone they can seek out in the playground to help them.

Buddies spend time together in the initial days of schooling, sitting together to eat at recess and lunch. Buddy activities are also planned each week, where the Year Six students (and Year Five, if required) complete literacy and numeracy activities together, fostering social skills and inclusiveness amongst the students of our school community.

Does St. Luke's Catholic Primary School have a bus service?

Yes we do, please contact Shepp Transit on 5831 2150 for Town Bus or Paul Lucas on 5825 2344 for Country Bus.

Do you offer After School Care?

Yes we offer after school care, not before school care, contact Stepping Stones on 1300 665 699 for all bookings and information.

What time should I drop off my child?

Supervision of children commences at 8.30am. Music sounds at 8.52am for children to unpack bags/ toilet/swap readers etc. and the morning bell sounds at 8.55am. Bell sounds for the end of the day at 3.15pm. Students on the early bus are cared for.

If I'm not in St. Luke's Catholic Primary School zone what should I do?

You will need to contact the school that you are zoned to and speak with the Principal and discuss your enrolment.

Do I need to place a deposit on school fees?

No, School fees will be sent out at the beginning of the year and then a statement is sent out each term

Do you have parent helpers in the classroom? Yes. A working with children's check is required.



Foundation Year Equipment List

Dear Parent/s and Carers.

Generally we provide the children with paper, art materials, books, etc... as part of the Levy paid. On your child's first day of school they will need to bring the following items to school:

(Some of the following items include things that children may receive as Christmas or "special" gifts from mum/dad/grandma/Santa, etc...)

- An art smock (available from Goulburn Valley School Uniforms)
- A Library Bag (available from Goulburn Valley School Uniforms);
- A School Bag (available from Goulburn Valley School Uniforms) & identification label;
- A Document Bag (for Reader Cover, notes, flashcards, etc...~ Available from Goulburn Valley School Uniforms);
- A "sipper" / drink bottle for water for the classroom;
- A drink for Recess & Lunch (kept in your child's school bag);
- Play lunch and Lunch in Lunch box/container (kept in your child's school bag);
 [Insulated Packs are ideal for keeping lunches cool in warmer weather].
- A piece / container of fruit or vegetable (for Fruit Break);
- **Two boxes of tissues** (to be handed into your child's teacher at the start of the year);
- **Spare undies / socks** in a plastic bag (only in the case of Preps).

Please ensure that all of the children's equipment and clothing is clearly named and labelled and that they know and are shown what is their property. Encourage your child to pack their bags in the mornings at home and unpack it at night. It is amazing how responsible and independent these "little people" are and can be with clear routines.

NB.: This list may change per year as needs arise.






Payment Options

There are a number of facilities available for payment of school fees:

- Direct Debit facility fees are debited from your nominated account on a fortnightly basis over 20 payments. Direct Debit Application forms will be sent home with accounts and need to be returned to the school office should you wish to use this method of payment.

The Future of St. Luke's




In 2016 we finalised our MASTER PLAN. As you visit our school it will make more sense when you refer to the plan. We submitted a state grant for one module and toilets (1 module= 4 classrooms). The pathway network was added at the start of 2017, along with landscaping, relocating some trees and extending our grass area.

We are at the final stage of discussions regarding the following:

- 1. Piping rural water along the highway
- 2. Addressing the drainage issues for the entire site
