# **Curriculum Update:**

## Children's Chatter Matters!



Term 2 : Vocabulary activities

When reading a text with your child, discuss words that have tricky meanings ie; words you don't hear or see very often. Develop a weekly list of 5 tricky words eg; exhilarated, frantic, ogre, pessimistic, ambled. Encourage your child to draw a picture of each word or find a picture of the word on google images. Get them to use the word after watching

a TV program each day. For example I was so exhilarated after watching my favourite show I couldn't wipe the smile of my face.

#### Getting involved in School Banking is easy!

All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week on School Banking day using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.


