Principals Report:

St. Luke's FETE

Friday 24th November 4:00pm-8:00pm

As I sat in the meeting last night I was overwhelmed by the effort from those 10-12 people in the room. They are doing an amazing job, extremely well led by Karen Tidd, in organising our first fete and the rest of us need to support the event by just being present. Personally, I am looking forward to the spinning wheel part of the evening, as the prizes are sensational. Get your wristbands asap for the carnival rides from our office so we can have a better idea for catering. See Classes 2018 the Fete newsletter for all the information you need. This will come home as a hard copy and will also be emailed.

November Meetings

This week we had the Community Group and Fete meeting and next week we have the Board Tuesday 6:00pm, PPC Wednesday 7:30pm and a Fete meeting Thursday at 6:30pm.

Community Group- at present we have approximately \$25,000 in the account with \$5000 to go toward our maintenance/groundsman. After the Fete at the December meeting we will discuss expenditures such as:

- AC in the stadium (quote received)
- Football and Soccer posts for the new oval
- Seats around the current courts
- Reading Resources

These are just some items which have been discussed in the past. The meeting will be a good chance to look at our priorities and any changes/additions.

Oval/Irrigation/Drainage

The tenders have been received for this component of work. Fr. Joe (PP), Tom Sexton (CEO), Mark Harmer (DP), Paul Ranson (Board Chair) and myself will review and make a decision in the near future. The plan is for work to start toward the end of the year. The sowing of seed (grass) will be dependent on the other part of the work (Raw water access along the Highway). We will review this tender once received and determine starting/finishing date for this. This second component (Raw Water) is a jointly funded project with Notre Dame College. We have been meeting with Principal John Cortese and his team throughout the year. Both Emmaus (NDC) and St. Luke's are looking forward to watering their ovals with raw water, rather than town water!

Traffic in/out of St. Luke's

All schools have moments of congestion with car Drops offs/pick-ups. An issue is traffic from the Grammar side of the Highway turning right into St. Luke's. The peak time is around 8:50am when buses are leaving and turning right across the Highway coming out of St. Luke's. There is a

back-up of traffic at times in both directions. Please be very careful at all times, but especially when buses are present. Your view is obscured at times and it may be potentially very dangerous. With the future sub-division developments around St. Luke's we will make contact with the council and see if there are any future plans on the highway for traffic control. As a school board we will look ahead to increasing enrolments and extensions to the carpark.

The staff is presently engaged in working out classes for 2018. We have not finalised teachers, but hope this is done in the very near future. The teachers are the professionals making the decisions in teams for 2018 and then I look at the classes with Mark Harmer. These decisions will be pretty much final. I will consider requests, but not all requests will be met. If you feel you need to make a request, these are to be emailed to me and not the teacher. If you approach a teacher regarding this, they will not comment and direct you to email me. I will acknowledge receiving your request with a reply. If you do not receive this reply, please send it again, as I may have missed it, or did not receive it for some reason. The advantage for us at St. Luke's is that we have more than one class for each Learning Community. We form the class group based on several aspects. Some of these aspects are confidential and we cannot share, so please respect our final decision.

Frank York, our groundsmen continues to recover after his car accident in the holidays. He has not returned to work yet due to the nature of his injuries. We do miss his presence around the place and wish him a speedy recovery.

A couple of events where our community will be present. We will be laying a wreath at the Remembrance Day Ceremony tomorrow Saturday 11th November. The ceremony starts at 10:30am. On Sunday our school helps out in the food/drink tent for the Triathlon. A very different weather forecast compared to this time last year- it was freezing! I will see some of you out and about over the weekend.




